









Breast Self-Exam



BASIC METHOD

With the flat surface of your three middle fingers, check the entire breast and armpit area pressing down with light, medium, and firm pressure in circular motions.




LYING DOWN

When lying down, the breast tissue spreads out evenly along the chest wall. Place a pillow or folded towel under your shoulder. Then examine your breasts using the basic method described above.

Check both breasts each month feeling for any lump, thickening, hardened knot, or any other breast changes.
